The Policy Committee of Community High School District 99 met on Wednesday, April 27, 2022, at the Administrative Service Center. The meeting was called to order at 3:32 p.m.

- II. The following policies had revisions recommended by PRESS in its Update Memo. Revisions were in response to legislation, new public acts, and feedback. The Committee reviewed the current District 99 policies, which differed from the PRESS version. The consensus of the Committee was to adopt the PRESS version of the policies in their entirety.
 - o 2.260, Uniform Grievance Procedure
 - 4.80, Accounting and Audits In addition to adopting the PRESS policy in its entirety, the Committee recommends retaining the following that are currently in the District 99 policy:
 - under Annual Audit, the phrase "in accordance with School Code;"
 - under <u>Controls for Revolving Funds and Petty Cash</u>, the sentences related to where the funds are maintained and that approval by two administrators must be documented before the release of a revolving fund check; and
 - under <u>Capitalization Threshold</u>, the amounts of \$10,000 and \$5,000. Also, the maximum amount for District 99 revolving fund accounts is \$7,500.
 - o 5.125, Personal Technology and Social Media; Usage and Conduct
 - o 7.340, Student Records

The policies will be brought forward for First Reading on May 2, 2022.

- III. The following policy had revisions recommended by PRESS in its Update Memo. Legal is currently reviewing the recommended changes. The policy changes are on hold.

- IV. Review of new PRESS Policy.
 - 4.165, Awareness and Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse and Grooming Behaviors
 The Committee recommends adopting this policy.

The policy will be brought forward for First Reading on May 2, 2022.

- V. The following policies had revisions recommended by Administration:
 - 3.69, Assistant Controller (renamed as Chief School Business Official Effective July 1, 2022) – Dr. Thiele stated this policy has been revised and renamed to reflect additional responsibilities of the position and is part of the process to prepare for the retirement of Mark Staehlin.
 - 7.100, Health, Eye, and Dental Examinations; Immunizations; and Exclusion of Students – Dr. Thiele explained the change is to reflect the current practice of allowing students who do not meet the District's examination and immunization requirements, due to extenuating circumstances, be allowed to start school. He noted the October 15 date, as mandated by ISBE, is the final date to submit records, before a student is excluded from school.

The policies will be brought forward for First Reading on May 2, 2022.
